4. Head Teacher Report

- Sandwich program at lunch in the gym kitchen is ongoing, kids are not bringing a lunch or enough food, some are eating their lunch at recess
- Funding for the Sandwich program is thru Feeding Futures (about 9 thousand), Ms. Kerluke takes the funds and picks up sandwich meat, veges and bread from Costco
- intermediate kids make their own sandwiches, while primary kids are assisted by Ms. Kerluke
- consistently feeding 5-10 kids every day
- Costco Club still ongoing, kids pick up donated food to take home
- apples are offered for free at the office
- also Firefighter donation program give snacks and juice boxes 3 times per year
- French Carnival to be held with support by Ms. Kerluke Feb 21st afternoon
- Grade 7's will do leadership activities for French Carnival

6. Snack Shack Update

- update by Brandi
- last week they split the intermediates into two groups b/c too many kids at once, divised by North and South side of the school
- however it did not go well as there was confusion and kids from both sides still came
- need more volunteers for Snack Shack on Thursdays, volunteers can come and stay for as long as they can for the duration of the Shack being open

7. Pancake breakfast

- update provided by Vivian
- could not get outside volunteers (ie. Lions Club) to help out
- got quotes from Fuel, Denny's, McDonalds
- McDonalds was able to quote the best price for party trays of cooked pancakes
- McDonalds pancakes, coffee, syrup, cutlery, plates, candy canes, juice boxes and a limited quantity of oranges
- Gluten free pancakes will be made by PAC the morning of
- \$1600 towards to pancake breakfast voted as PASSED by PAC
- 480 students, strong start kids, staff, volunteers
- kids will be encouraged to wear pajamas

8. Saleema Noon

- kerluke paid for the Saleema Noon program last year and facilitated the sexual health program at Cascades using the program
- cost was \$150 and was valid for one month
- last year's focus was on puberty and sex education, it was a detailed program.
- this year Ms. Kovac is the gym and health educators
- this year, Ms. Kerluke and Ms. Kovac are willing to team up and do the program for the kids and use the Saleema Noon material
- updated by Charmaine, cost for Saleema Noon is \$600+ tax for two days of presenters that would cover grades 4-7 only.
- discussed whether this is an option to have Saleena Noon presenters to just teach grade 4-7, then have Ms. Kerluke and Ms. Kovac teach the primary kids- no opinions on this came up
- discussed the cost of having the Saleema Noon people attend Cascades this year and since a detailed sex education was provided last year, this year can be a not so in depth discussion on sexual health according to Ms. Kerluke

-PAC voted to hold off on getting Saleema Noon come this year, and will consider it for next year for a in depth discussion instead
